#### A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear parents/carers,

Welcome to our final ADMIN newsletter for the 2022 school year. It has been great to get back to regular schooling after the start to the year and

we have seen students progressing in their learning in all areas of the school.

Term 4 is another busy term with lots happening

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) relaunch — we have relaunched our Tier 1 PBL framework this term, after much collaboration and consultation with our school community. We have introduced a formal acknowledgement system for students called 'high-flyer' awards. Students receive a high-flyer award for following school rules of being safe, caring and successful learners. This is documented and shared with families at home. Students are further acknowledged during assembly each Friday. In addition, students who have received 15 and then 30 high flyer awards will receive a letter from the principal and students who receive 50 awards for the term will be invited to a 'Giraman celebration', which will be decided on through the student council. It has been great to see so many students receiving awards in the first three weeks of term and we look forward to celebrate this as we move forward this term.

**World teachers Day** — World teachers' day is Friday 28<sup>th</sup> October. I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge all our teaching staff here at Currimundi Special School and thank them for their ongoing commitment to supporting student learning here at Currimundi Special School.

**Student transitions** – We are looking forward to supporting student transitions as we approach the end of the Term, in preparation for 2023. Year 6 students will have the opportunity to engage in secondary activities later in the term, to support familiarisation of new blocks, playgrounds and facilities for 2023. We will also be welcoming our new families to our school throughout the term and will be farewelling our Year 12 students at their formal on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> November and their final assembly and clap out on Friday 18<sup>th</sup> November.

**School Opinion Survey** – Many thanks to all our families who completed the School opinion survey for 2022. This data will continue to inform our planning into 2023 and beyond. 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# A MESSAGE FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL (Teaching and Learning)

**PBL:** This term we have launched our new whole-school acknowledgement system for PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning).

No doubt by now you have seen Giraman tickets coming home. Students receive a Giraman 'High Flyer' ticket when they are following the school rules 'caring, safe, successful learners'. When students reach 15 and 30 tickets they will get a letter home from the Principal. Half way through term, there will be a small acknowledgement of all students who have reached 20 or more tickets, and then at the end of term we will have our Giraman celebration day for all students when they reach 50 tickets. Student council are currently deciding what this will look like.

In reviewing our PBL systems and practices, it's been important to ensure that we have input from our students and families. Our PBL mascot Giraman (pronounced 'gurrumun') is a flying fox. Currimundi means 'place of the flying fox'. Thank you to everyone who responded surveys to inform our process.

This week we hosted the regional special schools PBL Community of Practice. This was a great opportunity for us to share our new practices, and network and gain knowledge from other special schools in terms of best practice in implementation of PBL.

Collegial Engagement: This term we also started our collegial engagement implementation. Collegial engagement gives staff opportunity to be part of observation and feedback processes to further develop professional capacity. Over time this will include learning from colleagues who are 'lead teachers' in different areas. It means our professional development can be explicitly linked to our school data and needs.

**QCIA:** At the end of year 12, students achieve their QCIA. This will be mailed to homes, so for our school leavers, keep an eye out towards the end of December/early January for this.

Year 10 into Senior Secondary Information Session: We will be holding an information session for our parents and carers of our year 10 students about what senior secondary looks like at Currimundi Special School, including the opportunity to complete our first Cert 1 course in Active Volunteering. Over the next few years we will be introducing more Cert 1 opportunities for our senior secondary students. 'Save the date' information was sent home this week, and a formal invitation will be sent home towards the end of the month.

**Christmas Concert:** We're starting to prepare for

our concert. The theme is 'Summer'. More information will be coming home soon – but save the date for Tuesday of week 10 (6<sup>th</sup> December).

It's hard to believe the year is almost over. I'm looking forward to catching up with families at our events this term.
