This funding will be used to

- Support and upskill teachers in the teaching of numeracy to students with disabilities. Teachers will improve their knowledge of teaching numeracy which will result in consistent teaching of numeracy across the school.
- Support and upskill teachers to improve communication and communication systems for students with disabilities. Teachers will continue to improve their knowledge of teaching communication which will result in more informed decisions of using specific communication systems for students with communication difficulties.
- Provide additional support for students with complex communication needs to improve receptive and expressive communication. Teachers and teacher aides will improve their knowledge in skills in provided targeted support for students complex learning needs and communication difficulties.

Our initiatives include


- Support and mentoring for teachers to develop their skills and the quality of teaching of numeracy.
